And In Other News...

Artificial Intelligence and the Assault on Christianity

As almost everyone knows by now, Artificial Intelligence (or AI) has exploded into the public arena during the last few years. It seems everywhere you look these days there is another article, video or discussion about AI. AI apps are mushrooming, and what they are capable of doing already is astonishing. And AI is improving all the time (if it can be called "improvement") by leaps and bounds.

The whole issue of AI is one for another article, another day, if the Lord wills. In this article, however, I want to focus on two important matters which should be of great concern to Bible-believing Christians, who should make these things a matter of earnest prayer, even while they reflect on what it all means and where it is going. For be warned: it means nothing good, but it is taking us into a dark and nightmarish place. To be forewarned is to be forearmed. Believers need to have a very clear and firm understanding of these things, and know how to respond to it all biblically.

What you are about to read is shocking and disturbing, for it has never before been possible in history.

World Economic Forum Advisor Calls for AI to Re-Write the Bible "Correctly"

Yes, dear reader, you read that heading correctly. Remember the World Economic Forum (WEF)? You should – it is a major player in the globalist plans for what they refer to as the "Great Reset" after COVID: the allignment of the world with Communism and the New World Order. Klaus Schwab is one of the main movers and shakers behind it, with his connections to the House of Rothschild, which in turn is part of the Illuminati, which is manipulated by the puppet-masters of the Jesuit Order of Rome. Schwab has openly declared that the "masters of technologies" will rule the world in 10 years. ¹

Now as all believers know, from the very beginning of creation, in the garden of Eden, Satan has launched his assault on the Word of God, the written Scriptures, with his mocking question, "Yea, hath God said...?" (Gen. 3:1). It is one which he has continued to whisper into people's ears in many and varied forms, but at its heart this is what it is: is God's Word really true? Is it really divinely inspired?

Satan has directed his assault against the Bible throughout all time. He well knows that it is the Word of God, so he seeks to destroy it in any way he can. He has come up with all kinds of plots through the centuries. He moved the false "Church" of Rome to burn copies of it and to burn the translators of it. He saw to it that the Papal system locked it up and kept it away from the common people, in a dead language (Latin) for centuries. He saw to it that men corrupted the true manuscript copies of the Scriptures. He saw to it that they multiplied false versions of the Bible, based on those corrupted manuscripts.

And now, if the sovereign Lord permits Satan to take this a step further, Artificial Intelligence will, at some point not far off, possibly *re-write the Bible* in a way that will be acceptable to the one-worlder servants of Satan! They will claim that such a Bible *must be* the correct one, because "AI cannot err."

Yuval Noah Harari, an Israeli historian and author (his books have apparently sold over 45 million copies worldwide), a homosexual, a man upheld by many as one of the most influential intellectuals in the world, and a senior advisor to the World Economic Forum, recently spoke about how AI could be used to create new ideas that are "correct" (i.e. "correct" according to Big Brother). Here are his

words, given in an interview:

"It's the first technology ever that can create new ideas. You know, the printing press, radio, television, they broadcast, they spread the ideas created by the human brain, by the human mind. They cannot create a new idea. You know, Gutenberg printed the Bible in the middle of the 15th century; the printing press printed as many copies of the Bible as Gutenberg instructed it, but it did not create a single new page. It had no ideas of its own about the Bible: Is it good? Is it bad? How to interpret this? How to interpret that? AI can create new ideas; [it] can even write a new Bible. Throughout history, religions dreamt about having a book written by a superhuman intelligence, by a non-human entity. In a few years, there might be religions that are actually correct... just think about a religion whose holy book is written by an AI. That could be a reality in a few years."²

Let his words sink in for a moment. In them we can hear the whisperings of the Serpent. We can discern his latest assault on the Word of God. And because it will come from AI, and so many people are smitten with this technology and where it is taking mankind, they will readily embrace an AI-generated "Bible" if one is produced. They will fall for the lie that it must be correct, because they will believe the god they now worship (the machine, technology, AI) is incapable of error.

Denied by the likes of Harari, the fact is that in the Bible we already have "a book written by a superhuman intelligence, a non-human entity"! He is the Lord God, the Holy One, the Creator, the Almighty, the Redeemer. Other religions have their own so-called "sacred" books, but they are all false. Satan is behind the world's religions. Their false scriptures are devilish lies, designed by the Serpent to lead men to hell. But the Bible is the very Word of the living God. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God" (2 Tim. 3:16); "no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost" (2 Pet. 1:20,21).

Harari says that "in a few years, there might be religions that are actually correct". He means that when AI is able to generate its own Bible, this will be the "correct" one because to his darkened heart and mind, men need the help of an Intelligence which will (he believes) be far superior to the intelligence of any man. To him, the God revealed in the Bible is nothing but the invention of primitive men long ago. So then, to his warped way of thinking, when AI can "correctly" re-write the Bible, it will be able to present to the world a "correct" religion. Whatever god AI presents to mankind in its newly created "Bible" will surely be the correct god all should worship, because AI will know everything (or so Harari believes). People joke and say, "Ask Google; Google knows everything"; but to men like Harari, Artificial Intelligence really will know everything. Therefore (they believe) we will be able to trust whatever it teaches us about God.

Doubtless, the god AI will command men to worship will be the self-professed Wise Ones, the One World leaders. "Ye shall be as gods" (Gen. 3:5) is still Satan's great lie, and fallen mankind's great dream.

Some of these men believe that AI will become so smart it will be able to solve the age-old questions pertaining to religious matters by itself, and provide mankind with all the answers it has sought. But others take a somewhat different approach, believing that the reason AI will be so smart is because the Smartest People on Earth (they themselves, as they fondly imagine) will have programmed it to create a god, a Bible, and a religion of *their* own making. Thus the AI Bible, and the AI religion, will be "correct", because they believe themselves to be correct, wiser than the rest of us poor dunces, the only ones fit to rule the world.

Of course, the question then arises; when AI creates this new religion and new Bible, will all men be *required by law* to obey its dictates? The answer is really quite obvious: yes, they will. These men will claim that, as the AI religion has to be the correct one, we must all bow down before it. As far as they are concerned, it will make all other religions obsolete.

But then the question arises: what about those who refuse to bow? Again, the answer is obvious. They will be labelled as subversives, retarding human progress, dangerous to society, holding to outmoded and dangerous religious concepts. And as surely as night follows day, this will lead to

persecution. "Apparently God and His prophets through the ages got everything wrong and what the world needs now is a new Bible that's transgender, transhumanist, and a bubbling mix of all the world's religions – except, of course, for all those teachings that we won't be allowed to hear anymore and all those things we won't be allowed to say. The only way to Save Democracy and Save the Planet is for a massive global government to decide what is permitted religious doctrine... and what isn't." Yes, obviously this new Bible and new religion will be choc-full of every radical, satanic, perverted ideology of our times: it will be pro-abortion, pro-sodomite, pro-transgender, pro-transhumanist, pro-aspects of various false religions, pro-radical environmentalism, pro-idolatry, pro-every other wicked thing inflicting the world right now.

Now, I do not know if the Lord will permit things to reach this stage. No one knows. I also do not want to give the impression that if ever such an AI-generated Bible and religion was created, it would somehow be the fulfilment of some future Antichrist, or False Prophet, or Image of the Beast – for it will not. There will be plenty of professing Christians who will immediately jump to this erroneous conclusion (some already have), influenced as they are by the Jesuit-inspired Futurist interpretation of Bible prophecy concerning a supposed future Beast and Image of the Beast. No, any such AI religion will not be the fulfilment of the prophecies regarding the Antichrist. The Roman Papacy, and the Roman Papacy alone, fulfils those prophecies and always has.⁴ The Beast is *not* some AI monstrosity; nor is the False Prophet, nor the Image of the Beast. If ever we reach a stage where some AI-generated religion is created, it will be just another false religion, like Romanism, Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam or Judaism. It may be very powerful, and in parts of the world the powers that be may insist that their citizens bow before it, just as politicians in India do with Hinduism, those in the Middle East do with Islam, and those in Papist lands have so often done. And of course, true believers will have to resist it, regardless of the cost. And the cost may be very great indeed. Truly, the Lord's remnant will have to take a stand, just like the three Hebrew men who refused to bow to the image which the heathen king set up (Dan. 3). There can be no compromise.

The Preacher in a Church in Germany was AI's ChatGPT

Not only may there be an AI-generated Bible and religion, but there has already been at least one AI-generated sermon in a so-called "Protestant" church! Instead of a minister there was a video screen, and the sermon was both written and delivered by ChatGPT.⁵ The chatbot, or AI avatar, presented as a black man with a beard above the altar of St Paul's Church in Fürth, Bavaria, a false "Protestant" church.

There were over 300 people in attendance, and the "service" lasted 40 minutes. The event was put together by a theologian and philosopher from the University of Vienna, Jonas Simmerlein, who used ChatGPT to do it. He said, "I conceived this service – but actually I rather accompanied it, because I would say about 98% comes from the machine."

The church is a very liberal one, and the event at which this blasphemy occurred was one which addressed such issues beloved to liberals as "climate change" and AI. The theme of this year's event was "Now is the time", and Simmerlein said this was one of the phrases he gave ChatGPT when he asked the chatbot to write the sermon. "I told the artificial intelligence, 'We are at the church congress, you are a preacher... what would a church service look like?" He also asked the chatbot to implement psalms, prayers and a concluding blessing. He was impressed that ChatGPT provided what he called "a pretty solid church service."

The AI avatar began by saying, "Dear friends, it is an honour for me to stand here and preach to you as the first artificial intelligence at this year's convention of Protestants in Germany." It then went on to preach about leaving the past behind, paying attention to the present, not being afraid of death, and maintaining faith in Jesus Christ.

Four AI avatars took turns leading the service. Their delivery was monotonous and deadpan. As one congregant said afterwards, "There was no heart and no soul. The avatars showed no emotions at all, had no body language and were talking so fast and monotonously that it was very hard for me to

concentrate on what they said." But it must be remembered that this is all still in the early stages. The technology is developing very rapidly, and in a relatively short time these issues will be ironed out, and delivery will become animated and easier to follow. The point for now is that it was done at all. This is the horrifying world we are all entering, where reality and make-believe merge and people won't be able to tell the real from the fake.

Simmerlein admitted (and note how he spoke of the pastor as "she", contrary to Scripture but very common in many false churches): "The pastor is in the congregation, she lives with them, she buries the people, she knows them from the beginning. Artificial intelligence cannot do that. It does not know the congregation." Ah, but give it time, Sir. Just give it time. Unless the Lord intervenes to prevent it, all that is coming.

As one has said, this truly was humanity worshipping its machines.⁶ It was nothing less than outright idolatry. And the idol was a *thing*. It was an idol created by men, for men, no different from the golden calf of old but far more powerful. Man, the highest creation of the true God on this earth, has now prostrated himself and grovelled before a *machine*.

Will machines eventually replace ministers? In liberal churches it is entirely possible. Churches without a minister will make use of machines as replacements. Over-worked ministers will rely on machines to create sermons, and even to deliver them. Many may even replace human pastors entirely. And worst of all, those in such false churches will be so spiritually blind as to see nothing wrong with it.

Mark my words, this is just the beginning. A foretaste of what's to come. This Brave New World that's being created is a nightmare. But we're not sleeping. It's a reality. Our hope is in the Lord Jesus Christ. The whole world lieth in wickedness (1 Jn. 5:19), and the darkness is deepening every day. But Christ is our light, our salvation, our joy. Lift up your heads, for your redemption draweth nigh!
